



City and Mediacom Agree on Amended Franchise Agreement


On April 16, 2013, the City and Mediacom entered into a Franchise Agreement for cable. As a condition of the Franchise, Mediacom agreed to extend cable and internet into portions of the City not previously served. The City could also share in the cost of extending additional cable and internet to unserved parts of Medina.

On October 20, 2015, the Medina City Council approved an amendment to the Franchise Agreement with Mediacom. The amended agreement clarifies the buildout of 37.46 miles of System facilities and cable (excluding Drops) in the City over a four year period. Mediacom has constructed or will construct and activate 19.46 miles of System facilities and cable (excluding Drops) at its sole cost and expense on the following schedule: 6.46 miles were constructed in 2014, 5 miles were constructed in 2015 and 8 miles will be constructed in 2016. Below is a map showing the 2014 and 2015 construction areas.

The amended franchise clarifies that buildout will proceed on the following schedule (see table below). The City and Mediacom may share in the cost of the "Shared Miles", with the cost to the City to not exceed \$12,000 per mile. The cost will be paid by the City though franchise fees received through the Agreement.

Mediacom will be providing proposed buildout maps by February 1st in 2016 and 2017 to the City of Medina.

Speak Up! Speak Out! What is Your Vision for Medina?



Within the last month, the City has embarked on the process of updating its Comprehensive Plan. The first stop in the journey is to create a vision which will guide the process. A Visioning Event was held on November 9th at which residents took part in exercises to help craft the vision. A Steering Committee has been formed and has taken information from the event and suggested the draft vision above. The Steering Committee has also drafted overarching goals/objectives from this vision.

Land Use Applications Under Review

Bradford Creek Plat and ROW Vacation – 2872 Ardmore Ave. – The applicants request plat approval to re-plat eight substandard lots in Independence Beach into two buildable lots. The applicants have also requested that the City vacate a portion of right-of-way to the north of the subject site in which there is currently no roadway improvements. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for the December 8 Planning Commission meeting.

Kal Point Site Plan Review, PUD Amendment – 340 Clydesdale Trail – The applicant requests an amendment to the Medina Clydesdale Marketplace PUD and a Site Plan Review to construct a commercial building containing a restaurant and upstairs office space. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for the December 8 Planning Commission meeting.

45 Highway 55 Rezoning – The applicant requests the City rezone property to the east of Aldi from Uptown Hamel-2 to Commercial Highway-Railroad. The rezoning is in anticipation of commercial development of the site. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for the December 8 Planning Commission meeting.

Woodland Hill Preserve sign variance 696 Woodland Hill Court – The applicant requests a variance from the setback requirements for signs for the neighborhood monument sign of Woodland Hill Preserve. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for the December 8 Planning Commission meeting.


Holiday Safety

The Medina Police Department wants to protect you during the holidays!

Holiday Shopping—When doing your holiday shopping at the mall, make sure you park in a well-lit area. Lock your vehicle and hide valuables preferable in the trunk or locked compartment. Remember to be aware of your surroundings. If you see anything or anyone suspicious, immediately call 911 and report the incident to police.

Online shopping is becoming more and more popular for convenience. If you do shop online, remem-

ber that the Internet does have risks. Protect yourself. Make sure you have the most current anti-virus and anti-spyware security. Never use an unsecured wireless network to make an online purchase. Prior to making an online transaction and before entering any personal or financial information,



Keep Your Home Safe—Be cautious about locking doors and windows especially when you're away. If you do leave for the holidays or for the winter, make sure you call to arrange a house check. Police will then stop by and notify you (or your keyholder) of anything suspicious or out of the ordinary. Keep gifts and valuables out of plain view. Keep blinds and drapes or curtains closed. If a burglar can see those items, they may attempt to enter your home. If a person you are not familiar with knocks on your door, don't feel obligated to open the door for them. Teach your child to do the same.

Message from the Minnesota Department of Revenue: SCAM ALERT

The Minnesota Department of Revenue is warning customers about a scammer knocking on doors posing as an agent from the Department of Revenue. The scammer demands that the victim make immediate payment of back taxes owed. If you encounter a similar scam, please contact your local law enforcement.

The department never contacts customers demanding immediate payment without first mailing a letter, and the department will not threaten to send the police to a customer's home. Here are four things a scammer may do, but the department does not:

- 1. Contact you about your balance due without contacting you by mail first.
- 2. Demand payments without contacting you by mail first
- 3. Require that you provide payment information over the phone.
- 4. Threaten to send the police or law enforcement.

If you are concerned about a potentially fraudulent visit, call, or email from someone who represents themselves as being from the Minnesota Department of Revenue, please call us at 651-296-3003 or 1-800-657-3909. An authorized Minnesota Department of Revenue staff member will be able to determine if the contact you received was legitimate.

Use caution and only provide personal information, including credit card information, when you are absolutely sure the situation is legitimate.



Utility Bill Changes in 2016

Beginning in 2016, watershed dues will be broken out separately on utility bills. Medina boundaries fall within three watersheds; Pioneer-Sarah Creek, Elm Creek and Minnehaha Creek. Of the three, Pioneer- Sarah and Elm Creek collect their fees from the City (the City of Medina serves as a pass through). Minnehaha Creek collects their fee through property taxes. Watershed fees are 100% determined by the individual Watershed. Watershed fees collected through utility bills will be done once a year rather than breaking the fee out monthly. Residents within the Minnehaha Creek Watershed will not see a watershed charge on their utility bills. Changes to City Code Regarding Dogs

At the November 17, 2015 City Council meeting, an ordinance was adopted amending the city code regarding dogs. With the increased residential growth in the community, the City has recently received increased complaints regarding off lease dogs and dog waste. The city code has now been updated to adequately address these

The updated code (1) prohibits female dogs from being left outdoors unless they have been spayed, (2) requires that dogs that are being walked off their owner's property be under restraint unless in an officially designated off-lease area (in the area of the city served by municipal sanitary sewer and water dogs must be on a leash no longer than six feet in length) and (3) requires the animal's owner, if off their property, to pick up their dog's feces and dispose of it properly.

Snow Plowing & Winter Reminders

Winter Parking—The City ordinance prohibits parking on any public street from November 1st through March 31st during the hours of 1:00 a.m. – 6:00 a.m. If at all possible, the City plow crew would appreciate having no vehicles parked on City streets when snowfall occurs during the

Snow Plow Policy—When snowfall occurs, the City considers amount of snowfall (usually 2-3"), time of day, day of week, wind speed and direction, temperature, personnel and equipment availability, as well as the weather forecast before beginning snow or ice control operations. The City snow plowing priority schedule is 1) main collector roads, 2) residential streets, 3) cul-de-sacs and dead end streets, and 4) trails. The City uses a salt-treated salt and/or salt-sand mixture (20% salt). The City does not have a bare pavement policy, but by re-plowing and scraping we come fairly close, except in the -20 degree weather.

No permanent structures may be placed in the right-of way such as rocks, monuments, metal poles, etc. that would hinder public safety, snow removal, drainage, or other Public Works operations. The right-of-way can be as much as 16' from the edge of the road up onto the property.

To limit damage to sod, it is advised to place a marker along curb lines; however, metal poles are strictly prohibited within the City right-of-

The City Snow Plowing-Ice Control Policy can be seen in its entirety on the city's website at http://medinamn.us/citygov/departments/public -works-dept/.

Mailboxes—Please check your mailbox for sturdiness and get repaired as needed, as the City is not responsible for mailboxes damaged by snow being pushed off the roads.

Ice Control—Be cautious of what you use and the amount you apply for your own personal ice control, as it will eventually end up in the storm sewer and out to our lakes and rivers. It is the responsibility of property owners to remove snow on their own sidewalks.

Garbage/Recycling—On garbage and recycling days, please place receptacles out of the way so they will not be hit when snow is being plowed.

Police Regulations & Parking City Code Changes

At the November 17, 2015 City Council meeting an ordinance was adopted regarding police and parking regulations. The purpose of the ordinance was to update rules and regulations related to traffic and vehicle parking. The ordinance updates several references to state law. The ordinance also updates the types of vehicles which are regulated to include motorcycles and other motorized bicycles. The ordinance prohibits the parking of certain commercial vehicles in certain areas for more than four hours. It also imposes a twelve-hour parking limit on public streets for vehicles, equipment such as construction equipment, and trailers.
