

THIS PERMIT IS LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

Prior to burning, applicant is required to check the DNR website to determine if any burn bans are in place. During the spring green up burn ban, no burning is allowed. (Exceptions for DNR variances for prairie burns by professional companies) DNR contact information www.mndnr.gov/burnrestrictions or call 651-296-6157.

1. The prevailing winds, at the time of the burn, shall be away from nearby residences and building. Strong or gusty winds will cancel permit. No burning is allowed if the wind is over 15 mph. (We encourage you to contact the National Weather Service for an up-to-date fire weather forecast prior to burning.)
2. Prohibited: salvage operations and any materials collected or accepted from locations other than the property on which the burning is to occur, including, but certainly not limited to, brush, wood waste, and organic waste. See Medina City Ordinance #505.07.
3. The burning shall be conducted as far away as practical from any highway or public road and controlled so that a traffic hazard is not created.
4. The location of the burn shall not be within 300 feet of an occupied residence other than those located on the property on which the burning is being conducted.
5. Oils, rubber, and other similar smoke producing materials shall not be burned or used as starting materials.
6. The recipient of this permit, or his authorized representative, shall be present for the duration of any fire authorized by this permit.
7. Any fire allowed by this permit shall be extinguished within (4) four hours of a public announcement by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency that an air pollution alert, warning, or emergency exists. Such burning SHALL CEASE until a similar announcement terminates the alert, warning, or emergency. The applicant shall have the means to extinguish the fire present at the site at all times.
8. This permit is subject to revocation and inspection at the discretion of the Medina Director of Public Safety, his designee, a DNR Forest Officer, the local fire authority, or the permit issuer if:
 - a) A reasonable, practical method of disposal of the material is found;
 - b) A fire hazard exists or develops during the course of the burn;
 - c) Any of the conditions of the permit are violated during the course of the burn; or any other reasonable conditions the Medina Police Department may impose to protect life and property:
